

COMMUNIQUE

FRAUDULENT "SPEEDING VIOLATION" NOTICES ON SOCIAL MEDIA

The Ministry of Land Transport wishes to inform the public that a fraudulent message is currently circulating on various social media platforms and messaging applications concerning an alleged "Speeding Violation" notice.

The message falsely claims to be issued by a "Mauritius Transport Authority" and mentions that a 50% discount is applicable if a fine is paid within 24 hours.

The Ministry wishes to bring the following to the attention of the general public:

- Traffic enforcement and the issuance of **Fixed Penalty Notices (FPN)** are strictly regulated under the **Road Traffic Act**. Official notices are served through established legal protocols and not via unsolicited social media messages or informal digital alerts.
- The claim regarding a "50% reduction for payment within 24 hours" is entirely fabricated. No such provision exists under current legislation for speed camera violations.
- The "Mauritius Transport Authority" mentioned in the post does not exist. Official road safety and traffic matters fall under the jurisdiction of the **National Land Transport Authority (NLTA)** and the **Traffic Management and Road Safety Unit (TMRSU)**, with enforcement carried out by the **Mauritius Police Force**.

The Ministry strongly advises members of the public to ignore and delete this message. Do not click on any links, share personal data, or attempt to make payments through any platform referenced in such messages.
