

Competition Commission: Media briefed on Trade Association and Cooperatives Amnesty Programme

The Executive Director of the Competition Commission, Mr Vipin Naugah, held a press briefing today in Port Louis to brief members of the media about the features, operation and benefits of the recently launched the Trade Association and Cooperatives Amnesty Programme (TACAP).

Mr Naugah explained that the TACAP is a one-off amnesty programme designed to encourage trade associations, professional bodies and cooperatives to voluntarily disclose with supporting information, certain types of cartels and to cooperate fully in ceasing such conducts and ensuring compliance with competition law going forward.

It is recalled that the TACAP emanates from the “Competition Commission Trade Association and Cooperatives Amnesty Programme Regulations 2026 (GN 53 of 2026)” which became operational on 25 May 2026 and will remain valid until 25 November 2026.

The initiative forms part of the Competition Commission’s efforts to strengthen compliance with competition legislation and foster a more competitive and transparent business environment in Mauritius.
